

**“Teach for Better Hearing”**  
***Continuing education scholarship program for teachers***

Interactive teaching method for children with hearing impairment  
The Eduplex, Pretoria (South Africa)

The *Hear the World* Foundation and Eduplex have recently introduced “Teach for Better Hearing,” a continuing education program focused on processes for integrating children who are hearing impaired into the classroom and improving their overall education experience.

The *Hear the World* Foundation, launched in January 2007, was created to financially support initiatives related to the topic of hearing, as well as provide education and hearing technology to those in need. To this end, the Foundation created “Teach for Better Hearing.” Through the program, the Foundation will sponsor a select number of teachers from the United States to travel to the Eduplex, a unique school project in South Africa that was opened in Pretoria, South Africa by Nelson Mandela in 2002. Today, more than 380 students, those both affected and unaffected by hearing loss, are seamlessly taught in an integrated environment in the private elementary school. Via the “Teach for Better Hearing” program, the sponsored teachers will participate in a 2-week intensive training program to observe and learn how to integrate students who are hard of hearing into a normal classroom setting with other students who are unaffected by this disorder.

The aim of “Teach for Better Hearing“ and Eduplex is a worldwide opportunity of integration for children who are hearing impaired into regular schools, as well as the international implementation of the Natural Aural Approach, as it is being applied at the Eduplex. This approach implies that children who are hearing impaired learn best when taught alongside children with normal hearing, thereby receiving information through their ears, rather than by the assistance of sign language and other teaching and communication tools. An important part of the Natural Aural Approach is the use of hearing technology, as it is of great importance in a teaching method focused on spoken language.

As part of an ongoing follow-up, participating teachers will receive a visit from representatives from the Teach for Better hearing Committee to see how the program has been brought into their own classroom and to offer additional support to strengthen the teachers’ acquired knowledge from the program.

The scholarship includes coverage of costs for travel and training and – perhaps more important – development funds for the technological implementation of the method at the teachers’ home school, depending on respective need.

The “Teach for Better Hearing” program primarily addresses teachers from elementary schools. The following requirements need to be met in order to qualify for a scholarship starting fall 2007:

- Familiarity with or strong interest in the Natural Aural Approach
- Integrative teaching concept
- Experience working with hearing impaired children

Please submit your scholarship application for “Teach for Better Hearing“, including the following information, to the *Hear the World* Foundation no later than the **31st of December 2007**.

- Profile of your school
- Background of the teacher who would like to participate in the program
- Motivation behind the desired participation
- Overview of experience working with hearing impaired children

- Availability for training in Pretoria (possible dates in which the teacher could participate)
